## **Books with or about Letters**

#### Address Unknown by Kathrine Kressmann Taylor (1938)

Martin and Max, good friends and immigrants from Germany, run a successful art gallery in the USA in the 1930s. Martin decides to bring his family back home, but as a Jew, Max feels it's safer to stay in the USA and keep running the business. The friends stay in touch by writing letters, and gradually, Max is more and more horrified about the political opinions that Martin starts to express. Martin is completely absorbed by the Nazi rhetoric. Things culminate when Martin refuses to help Max's sister, and from then on, the letters become something more than just correspondence.

This book, entirely made up of letters, was published in 1938, as one of the first books that showed the true face of the Nazis, foreboding the atrocities to come during the war. With very few words, Kressmann Taylor conveys a sad and horrifying story. Much is left unsaid, but if the reader feels confused, the afterword found in later editions, written by the author's son, will explain the true meaning of the letters.

#### Dear Agnes by Håkan Nesser (2002)

Agnes has just lost her husband. At his funeral, her best childhood friend Henny shows up. They haven't been in touch for almost 20 years, but soon Agnes receives a letter from Henny and they start picking up their friendship again. After a while, Henny asks Agnes for a favour. It's a very special, almost strange thing, to ask of a friend, but Agnes agrees, and the two women start to plan something that slowly but surely seems to spin out of control.

Between the letters, Agnes tells the story of her childhood and friendship with Henny. As the book goes on, details from Agnes's past, many of which can be found between the lines, explain her current behaviour. At the end, not one but two plot twists send the book in new directions and the psychology of the characters fall into place.

#### Dear Mrs. Bird by AJ Pearce (2018)

Emmeline is a young woman in London during World War II. Her biggest dream is to be a war correspondent, but that's not an easy job to get. However, she does manage to get a job at a magazine. It's far from writing exciting war news though; she is to fill in for a columnist who answers letters from women, helping them with small everyday problems. There are strict rules about what kinds of letters she is to answer, mainly household issues, and how the answers can be written. But Emmeline can't stop herself from privately writing back, when women write heartbreaking letters and really really need help.

Parallel to the letters and work at the magazine, the book follows Emmeline's life in London during the Blitz. This is a heartwarming story, showing people cando what is best, not just for oneself but also for others, in a time of distress and danger.

#### **Love Virtually by Daniel Glattauer (2006)**

When Emmi sends an email to cancel a subscription of a magazine, her message ends up in Leo's inbox, due to a typo in the address. Eventually, he writes back, and so, quite by accident, Emmi and Leo start writing to each other. They lead completely different lives, but somehow both find comfort and enjoyment in these emails. The obvious question is if they should meet, and if they do, what will happen to this relationship, that means so much to both of them, if they see each other in real life and not just through words written on a screen?

This is a beautifully written story about an unexpected relationship, where feelings and thoughts are allowed to take up space in an otherwise busy world. The reader really gets close to the characters. The suspense about what will happen to them if they decide to meet makes it hard to put the book down.

#### Miss Austen by Gill Hornby (2020)

In the 1840s, many years after the death of her sister Jane, Cassandra Austen travels to Kintbury to visit the Fowle Family, longtime family friends of the Austens. The last Fowles are moving out of the home they have lived in for generations, and Cassandra has a very special reason for going there. Jane wrote many letters to Eliza Fowle, letters containing family secrets. Cassandra needs to find these letters, to protect her sister's reputation as a well renowned author. But maybe she also wants to protect herself from painful memories from her youth...

This is fiction, written in the spirit of Jane Austen's novels, but it is based on the real lives of the Austen family members. Going back and forth in time, between the 1840s and the time when the letters were written, the book tells the story of strong sisterhood and friendships, of lost love and dreams, and the lives of women in this time.



#### La Siréne et le Scaphandrier (The Mermaid and the Diver) by Samuelle Barbier (2020)

My Pet studied French 150 years ago or something and she likes to keep up with it (and show off a little) by reading books in French. This is one she randomly picked up in the library and loved it so much, we got Big Pet to read it with the help of Google Translate lens (because it's not in translation!) and she loved it too!

Zach, a tough New York prisoner joins a penpal scheme in jail because there's not much to do there otherwise. Hanna lives in London. She has agoraphobia and can't leave her flat lives, but her psychiatrist encourages her to join the scheme as well. The two unlikely pen pals soon start exchanging letters which getting longer and more heartfelt. Both trapped in their own ways, they share their dreams and start wanting to help each other with Zach encouraging Hannah to take tiny steps and start living her life again, by firstly getting a dog!

From an unlikely friendship, and unlikely romance develops, but, will they ever be able to meet, and can their friendship survive when Hannah finds out what caused Zach to be jailed?
